Bill of Complaint

6. That the said Mollie Kolb died during the month of December A.D. 1899, intestate and the said William N. Kolb died Dec. 18, 1900, intestate and the said Wm. N. Kolb died Dec. 18, 1900, intestate, both without personal property of any value sufficient to pay plaintiff claim, indebted to plaintiff Isaac L. Hankey in the sum of Seventy five dollars, by their promissory note dated January 4, 1896, which is filed herewith as Exhibit No. 2 to this bill.

7th That the said Wm. N. Kolb left surviving him the following named children in whom the said property vested at his death, as tenants in common, an adult son Wm. K. Kolb whose wife's name is Mary C. Kolb and adult daughter Lillie K. Kolb, an adult daughter Annie M. Rhoads whose husband's name is Samuel D. Rhoads all residents of Frederick County.

8th. That said Real Estate may be sold under a decree of your Honorable Court, and an accounting may be had under the direction of your Honorable Court of Plaintiff's claim, as well as of all other debts due and owing by the said Wm. N. Kolb at the time of his death.

To the said therefore:-

That said Real Estate may be sold under a decree of your Honorable Court, and an accounting had of the claim due plaintiff as well as all other claims due and owing by the said Wm. N. Kolb at the time of his death.

2nd That plaintiff may have such other and further relief as the nature of his case may require, may it please your Honorable Court to grant unto plaintiff the writ of Subpoena, directed to the said Rebecca Kolb, Sarah Kolb, his wife Annie K. Kolb, Michael Kolb, Mary Kolb his wife, William K. Kolb, Mary C. Kolb, Lillie K. Kolb, Annie M. Rhoads and Samuel D. Rhoads, her husband requiring them and each of them to be and appear in your Honorable Court on some day certain to be mentioned in said writ, and show cause if any they have why the relief prayed for in the Bill of Complaint should not be granted.
