Should she deem it best, she may sell the aforesaid estate and convey the same by deed in fee simple, but the purchase money of the same shall be permitted in real estate and she has the said Lucetta Young during her natural life and as long as she remains widow.

In case she should die or remarry, I direct the said real estate be sold at public sale to the highest bidder and the proceeds of said sale be equally divided between my sons Charles J. K., D. Edward and Otto Clyde Young share and share alike and the said Charles J. K., D. Edward and Otto Clyde Young shall constitute and be my Executors to sell and convey said real estate and the commission allowed by the Orphan's Court shall be equally divided between them.

2nd I will and devise all my personal property of whatever kind and character to my wife Lucetta Young absolutely and which she may dispose of in any manner she may desire except my son Charles J. K. Young may have my organ if he desires it (\$100.00) forty dollars, and one bureau and Army Rifle, without pay D. Edward Young is to have without charge one eight day clock and one Sable, Otto Clyde Young, is to have one corner cupboard one cabinet without charge.

3rd And I hereby constitute and appoint my wife Lucetta Young to be my Executor of this my last will and Testament and who shall not be required to give bond by the Orphan's Court in the settlement of my estate, and I hereby revoke and annul all former Wills by me made.

In testimony whereof I have hereunto set my hand and affixed my seal, this 24th day of July in the year of Our Lord 1897.
