Answer

Lucretia Young, Age 50 years. I reside near Middletown this County. I am one of the defendants in this suit, I know all the parties to this suit.

2nd. Did you know Daniel H. Young in his life time, is he living or dead, if dead when did he die, and did he die testate or intestate?

Ans. I was.

6. Have you taken out letters on your husbands estate?

Ans. Yes. A certified copy of said letters of Administration are hereby filed with the Examiner as evidence by the Plaintiff marked Exhibit No. 3.

7. Look at paper marked Exhibit No. 1. now shown you and state what it is and whose signature is appended thereto.

Ans. I look at paper Exhibit No. 1 now shown me, it is a promissory note under seal dated June 1st 1895 for the sum of \$140.00 with int. at 5% per annum payable to Mary E. Young one year after date. I have often seen my husbands signature. The signature thereto Daniel H. Young looks like my husbands hand writing.

At this juncture the said note Exhibit No. 1 is filed with the Examiner as evidence by the Plaintiff.

8. Will the personal property that your husband at the time of his death be sufficient to pay the debts due and owing by him at the time of his death.

Ans. No Sir. - It will fall short about \$500.00 I should think.

9. Was your husband seized and possessed of any real estate at the time of his death. If so what did the same consist and what is its value?

Ans. He owned a farm near Middletown in this County containing about 30 acres of land.
