Bill of Complaint

and considered as a part of this Bill of Complaint.

That the said Jonas F. Young was in his lifetime and at the time of his death indebted unto the Valley Savings Bank of Frederick County Maryland, upon his promissory note dated December 26th 1901 payable six months after date for the sum of Twenty five dollars which note was on the 12th day of July 1902 duly assigned to your complainant in writing as will appear by reference to said promissory note and assignment filed herewith marked Exhibit "B."

That the said Jonas F. Young was also in his life time and at the time of his death indebted unto a certain William E. Smith in the sum of Fifty dollars upon his promissory note bearing date April 1st 1897 payable twelve months after date with interest from date which said note has been duly assigned in writing to your complainant as will appear by reference to said note and assignment filed herewith marked Exhibit "C" and that there is still due and owing on account of said last mentioned promissory note the full amount of the principal thereof.

Second.

That the said Jonas F. Young being so indebted as aforesaid and being also indebted unto divers other persons in different amounts of money, departed this life intestate on or about the 7th day of March 1902, leaving surviving him no widow but the following children as his heirs at law, namely, your complainant, Edgar R. Young a son, Henry V. Young a son, whose wife's name is Vaurella Young, Alma B. Beachley a daughter who intermarried with D. Vincent Beachley,

Sollie V. Young a daughter and Luther A. Young a son, all of whom are adults residing in Frederick County, Maryland, also the following infant children of the said Jonas F. Young, namely, Malinda S. Young, Florence V. Young, Millard S. Young, Stanley F. Young and Clarence R. Young all of whom reside in Frederick County, Maryland.

Third.

That the said Jonas F. Young at the time of his death was seized and possessed of the following real estate situated in Frederick County, Maryland. (a) Part of a tract of land called the "Second resurvey on black doorn," and part of a tract called "Neighbors Content," containing in the aggregate thirteen acres and sixteen square perches of land more or less and which was conveyed unto the said Jonas F. Young and Anna S. Young his wife by deed dated April 1st 1881 executed by David Ausherman and Amanda L. Ausherman his wife, as will appear by reference to the original deed filed herewith marked Exhibit "D" the said Anna S. Young wife of the said Jonas F. Young having departed this life prior to the death of the said Jonas F. Young to-wit on or about the 20th day of May A.D. 1896, and the said Jonas F. Young that being entitled to the whole as a tenant by the entirety (b) Part of a tract of land called "Ebenezer" containing eight and one fourth acres of land more or less and which was conveyed to the said Jonas F. Young by deed executed by Carlton M. Yonkins and Margaret E. Yonkins, his wife dated February 8th 1896, duly recorded among the Land Records for Frederick County, as will appear by reference to the original deed filed herewith marked Exhibit "E."

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
