Testimony vs,

4th Where did your father leave surviving him as his heirs at law give their names ages & residence?

Ans. Edgar R. Young a son, the plaintiff in this cause, Henry V. Young an adult son, whose wife is Vanrella Young, Alma S. Beachley an adult daughter, whose husband's name is D. Vincent Beachley, Savilla V. Young an adult daughter, Luther A. Young, an adult son all of whom reside in Frederick County, Maryland, and the following infant children, Mahida S. Young, Florence W. Young, Millard S. Young, Stanley F. Young and Lawrence B. Young all of whom reside in Frederick County, Maryland, Our mother died in the year 1896.

Look at Exhibits "A", "B" & "C" now shown you & state what the same are?

Ans. I look at Exhibit "A" it is a note given by my father Jonas F. Young to me. It is dated April 1st 1901 and is for \$225.00 with interest from date the principal of said note and interest is still due and unpaid. I look at Exhibit "B" it is a note given by my father Jonas F. Young to the Valley Savings Bank of Middleton, and it is dated December 26, 1901 and is for \$25.00 I paid this note and it has been assigned to me, there is due on it the full amount, \$25.00 and interest thereon from June 26, 1902. I look at Exhibit "C" it is note given by my father Jonas F. Young to William E. Smith and is dated April 1st 1897, and is for \$50.00 I paid this note and it has been assigned to me, there is due and unpaid on it, the full amount of its principal and the interest from April 1st 1901.

Was your father at the time of his death seized and possessed of any Real Estate in Frederick County, and if you describe the same?

Ans. Yes:— Sir, he was, it consisted of a small farm of 13 acres located about 3 1/2 miles South West of Middleton which was conveyed to my father and mother by David Asherman & wife, I look at Exhibit "D" now shown me it is the deed for said land and correctly describes it, also of Eight acres of South Mountain land, about miles from Middleton which was conveyed to him by Carlton M. Youngkin and wife, I look at Exhibit "E" now shown me it is for the deed for said land and correctly describes it, in my opinion said lands are worth about \$1600.00

State whether or not there are any incumbrances on this Real Estate?

Ans. Yes there is there is a mortgage on it for \$800.00 to John W. Castle on which interest has been paid to April 1st 1902.

I look at Exhibit "F" it is a certified copy of said Mortgage.

8th Do you know anything about the personal estate left by your father at the time of his death?

Ans. Yes Sir:— I was appointed Administrator and the inventory filed by me in the orphan's Court showed a personal estate appeared at between \$500.00 or 300.00 insufficient in amount to pay father's debts.
