To the Honorable the Judges of the Circuit Court for Frederick County, sitting  
as a Court of Equity,

The Bill of Complaint of Dr James H. Waters of Frederick County, Maryland  
who sues as well for himself as for all the other creditors of Dorcas Pennell  
late of Frederick County, deceased, who will come in and contribute to the expense  
of this suit respectfully represents unto your Honorable Court,

First, That the said Dorcas Pennell was in her life time and at the time  
of her death indebted unto your complainant in the full and just sum  
of fourteen dollars and eighty five cent for sundry matters and things  
properly chargeable in account and for professional services which said  
account is filed herewith marked Exhibit "A" which said Exhibit, to-  
gether with all other exhibits herewith filed it is prayed may be taken  
and accept as a part of this Bill of Complaint.

Second, That the said Dorcas Pennell was in her lifetime and at the  
time of her death indebted unto one a certain Carrie V Bobbly in the full  
and just sum of twenty six dollars for sundry matters and things properly  
chargeable in account and for services rendered, which said account  
has been assigned to your complainant and is filed herewith as Exhibit  
"B" to this Bill of Complaint as a fact hereof.

Third,

That the said Dorcas Pennell being so indebted as aforesaid and being  
also indebted unto divers other persons in various sums of money and  
having real estate of considerable value, departed this life on or about the  
19th day of March in the year 1901 in Frederick County, Maryland in-  
testate.

Fourth, That no Letters of Administration have ever been taken out on  
the personal estate of the said Dorcas Pennell and that your complain-  
ant is informed, so charges, and very believes that the personal estate  
of the said Dorcas Pennell is exceedingly small and largely in-  
sufficient to pay the debts due and owing at the time of her death  
and the costs of Administration, funeral expenses and such other  
claims as may be properly chargeable against said personal estate.
