The Petition of John John C. Kaester filed in this cause on the 16th day of September, 1903, the answers thereto, testimony and other proceedings, having, by the Court been read and considered, it is therefore this 11th day of December, in the year nineteen hundred and three, by the Circuit Court for Frederick County sitting as a Court of Equity, and by the authority thereof, ordered, adjudged and decreed that the prayer of said petition be granted and that the claim of the said John C.
