

No. 7108. Equity

Decree pro Confesso was taken.

2. That subsequently, on the 5th day of December 1899, Charles E. King, one of the Defendants in the above cause filed in your Honorable Court, a Creditors Bill known as No. 7108 Equity praying for the sale of the real estate therein mentioned, being the same real estate sought to be sold under the proceedings in said No. 7103. Equity.

3rd. That all the Defendants in said No. 7108 Equity were duly summoned and made answer to said bill, except Cassandra Green and husband, against whom an interlocutory decree was taken.

4th. That with a view to avoid the double suits and consequent expenses, and for the purpose also of facilitating the further progress of the Court, an arrangement was entered into between counsel for the parties in interest, by which it was agreed that the two causes should be consolidated.

5th. That pursuant to said agreement testimony was taken in the last mentioned cause before one of the examiners of your Honorable Court, and duly returned thereto, and that said cause now stands ready for a decree.

6th. Your petitioners therefore, pray that an order may be granted, by your Honorable Court consolidating the causes known respectively as No. 7103, and No. 7108, Equity, on the docket of said Court, and for such other and further relief as the nature of their case may require.
