

No. 6948, Equity.

Mortgage and mortgage note for a like sum of money dated October 8th 1886, and duly recorded the original of said mortgage being filed herewith as exhibit No. 1, as part hereof.

3. That said sum of \$179.25 remains unpaid though long in arrears since July 1st, 1895.

4. That subsequent to the date and record of said mortgage of October 8, 1886, the Middle States Loan, Building and Construction Company, a body Corporate of the State of Maryland, with its principal office at Seatonsville, obtained a second mortgage on the mortgaged premises for the better security of a loan by them to Aolin W. Thomas the mortgage being dated July 28-1895, and duly recorded, and being for the sum of \$400, which said mortgage has not been released, and is believed to be still in force and unpaid.

5. That subsequent to the date of said second mortgage, the Standard Lime and Stone Company, a body Corporate, obtained judgment against said Aolin, the mortgagor aforesaid, for the sum of \$21.12 and 1.30 Cents and being dated Jan. 26th, 1897, and on May 5th, of said year Cornelius Vertz, also obtained a judgment against the said mortgagor for the sum of \$59.75, and \$1.00 Cents both of which judgments are recorded in Magistrate Docket No. 5, of the Circuit Court for Frederick County, That the subsequent lienors, or apparent Lienors, are therefore made parties defendant in this Cause, for a full adjustment of the rights of each.

To the end therefore,

1. That a decree may pass for the sale of said mortgaged premises mentioned and described in Exhibit No. 1, and the proceeds of sale, after the payment of the Cents, applied to the payment of the mortgage note of your oratrix with interest, and the surplus, if any, distributed to the parties entitled, according to their respective rights and interests, and

2. That your oratrix may have such other and further relief as the nature of her Case may require.

May it please your honor to grant unto your oratrix the writ of Subpoena directed to the above named defendants, to wit: to Martin McBride, Aolin W. Thomas, and Elvira Thomas, his wife, The Middle States Loan, Building and Construction Company, a body Corporate, and Cornelius Vertz, and the Standard Lime and Stone Company, a body Corporate, all of

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
