3. As your petition is satisfied that there will be a loss in case of a resale, your petition respectfully prays your honor, that under the circumstances, your honor will abate the price at which the property was knocked down to your petitioner, and if your honor will fix the price at \$1980, your petitioner will endeavor to have his friends aid him in complying with the terms of sale, and close at that price so, comply, but that he cannot comply at the price at which it was knocked down to him; and a resale will be necessary unless your honor will so abate the price, which abatement your petitioner is sure will be to the advantage of the heirs at law who are interested in the proceeds of sale. And as in duty bound &c.
