That on the 25th. of June, in the year 1889. William D. Brungle the brother of the said Francis Brungle, filed his Petition in the Circuit Court for Frederick County in Equity known as No. 5577. Equity, for a writ de liberacione inquirendo, to inquire into the soundness of mind of the said Francis Brungle. That said writ and the interrogations of the Jury found thereon was duly returned to your Honorable Court and on the 27th. day of June in the year 1889. William D. Brungle was appointed trustee or Commissioner of the said Francis Brungle, filed his duly approved bond and entered upon the discharge of his trust. As will appear by reference to proceedings in said No. 5577 Equity.

That the said Maria Brungle mother of the said William D. Brungle and Francis Brungle, departed this life sometime in the month of September, 1893 and by her last will and testament dated on the 17th. day of February in the year 1890 by the first Clause of said will did give and devise to her son William D. Brungle, to hold in trust for her son Francis Brungle, and to pay over to him the yearly rents and profits of the same all the interest she had in the dwelling house in which she then resided it being the dwelling erected on the Western half of Lot No 119 fronting on 2nd St and after some other bequests in trusts given in the second and third Clauses of said will by the fifth Clause said testatrix provided, that all the property inilled and devised and bequeathed to William D. Brungle for the benefit of Francis Brungle shall descend to any Child or Children of the said Francis Brungle. That the Sixth Clause of said will provided, that if said Francis Brungle dies leaving no Children, said property hereby bequeathed in trust for the benefit of said Francis Brungle was willed, devised and bequeathed to William D. Brungle, as will appear by reference to a Certified Copy of the will of the said Maria Brungle herewith filed and marked Exhibit No 8.

And your Complainant charges that after the death of the said Maria Brungle, the remaining portion of the Western half of lot No. 119, was vested as follows:— in Francis Brungle one undivided one fourth part devised by the will of his father Francis Brungle, one undivided one fourth part devised by the will of his
