The object of this Suit is to procure a decree for the sale of an one undivided one fourth interest, in certain real estate Situate in Frederick County, State of Maryland, formerly the property of Frances Brougle.

The Bill states that in the year 1846, a certain Frances Brougle was the owner of the Western half of lot No. 119, on the plat of Frederick-town, which formerly belonged to a certain Conrad Doll, and was devised by the will of said Conrad Doll to Solomon Stickle and others, and which is fully set forth in Exhibits 1 & 2, being the deeds from Solomon Stickle, et al, and Eleanor Reynolds to Frances Brougle. That the said lot was by the will of the said Frances Brougle to his wife Maria Brougle his two sons, William D Brougle and Francis Brougle, and his daughter Annie Brougle, in equal portions share and share alike. That William D Brougle by deed in Conjunction with his mother Maria Brougle and his wife Lettie Martin Brougle and Annie Brougle, in whom the entire title to said lot was vested, conveyed by deed the Northern portion of said lot to Emily C Phippley. That in the year 1889, Annie Brougle died intestate, unmarried and without issue, and her interest in said lot devolved to her two brothers William D Brougle and Francis Brougle as her only heirs at Law. That on the 25th day of June in the year 1889, Frances Brougle upon the Petition of William D. Brougle was adjudged a lunatic, the said William D. Brougle being appointed his Com-mit-tee, and entered upon the discharge of his trust, and removed the person of Francis Brougle to the State of Virginia. That Maria Brougle departed this life in Sept-ember 1893 and by her last will, dated 17th of February 1890, devised to William D. Brougle in Trust, for the use and benefit of Frances Brougle, for life, all her interest in the
