

No. 1797. Equity

North edge of the turnpike road leading from Baltimore to Frederick Town and running thence along said road, the following Courses to-wit, North fifty seven degrees West twenty four perches and eight tenths perch to a planted Stone, North fifty seven and a quarter degree West eighty eight perches to a Stone planted in a line of a lot of land now in possession of Abraham Johnson being also a part of the "Resurvey" or "Locust Level" then bounding on and with the Easternmost Side of the said Johnson's lot, North twenty seven and a half degree East fifty eight perches and seven tenths of a perch to a Stone marked "IB" set up for the beginning of 9 $\frac{1}{4}$ acres and six perches of of land, parts of the following tracts of land, to-wit, a tract of land called The "Resurvey" or "Meadow" a tract of land called "Pipe Meadow" a tract called "The Stumbling Block" and a tract of land called "Belview" which was conveyed by the late Richard Potts Esquire, to John Bruple, by deed bearing date on or about the 27th day of January 1807, then with the given line of said Bruple's deed reversed, North fifty degrees and thirty seven minutes East forty two and half perches to a Stone planted, then down and in the road commonly called the "Felling Mill road", the two following Courses, North twenty three degrees and one half degree East one hundred and twenty seven perches to a planted Stone, South eighty one degrees and twenty five perches to a planted Stone, and from thence by a straight line to the 1st place of beginning containing one hundred and ten acres of land; also one other tract, piece or parcel of land, being part of the aforesaid tract of land called "Belview" and part of lot No 7, which said is part of the "Resurvey" of "Locust Level" aforesaid and which said piece or parcel of land hereby intended to be conveyed is contained within the following Courses, limits, meters and bounds to-wit:-

Beginning at a Stone heretofore set up at the end of the 36" line of the whole tract called "Belview" aforesaid and running thence South fourteen and a half of a degree West one hundred and eighty three perches and three fourths of a perch to a Stone set up close to and on the Northern edge of the aforesaid turnpike road then along with the Northern edge of said road South sixty seven degrees and three fourths of a degree
