year 1904, by the Circuit Court for Frederick County sitting as a Court of Equity and by the authority thereof, adjudge, order and decree, that the trust fund in this case accrued, upon the death of Theodore S. Sauty without having lawful child or children, or the descendants of a lawful child or children, then living, to testatrix, Jeta S. Sauty, and to the children, then living of said testatrix's son Gideon William Algernon, Sidney and Edward Sauty, per stirpes. And it is adjudged, ordered and decreed that said trust fund, after the payment of the costs and expenses, in this cause, and in No. 4388 Equity, on the docket of this Court, a Commission of 5 per cent to the trustee as compensation for his care and trouble in the Management and distribution of said trust fund, and a Counsel fee of One hundred dollars to the Solicitor for said trustee, be divided into five equal parts or portions, that one of said parts or portions be allotted to Jeta S. Sauty; that one of said parts or portions, be allotted to Eugene H. Sauty, J. Marion Sauty, J. Ada Deitchman, H. Edmund Sauty and Julius A. Sauty in equal portions as the children of Gideon Sauty living at the death of Theodore S. Sauty; that another of said five equal parts or portions be allotted to William A. Sauty, Lurey S. Sauty, Mary W. Leukwa Lurey S. Sauty, Frank S. Sauty, Charles Sauty, J. Thomas Sauty, Edith S. Berry, Maurice J. Sauty, Daisy M. Dechman, Clyde L. Sauty, and Clarence Sauty, in equal portions, as the children of William Sauty, living at the death of said Theodore S. Sauty; that another of the said five equal parts or portions be allotted to Gideon L. Sauty, Elizabeth H. Sauty, Blanche H. Sauty, Linda M. Sauty, and Stella Sauty Coan, in equal portions, as the children of Edward Sauty living at the death of said Theodore S. Sauty; and that the other of the said five parts or portions be allotted to Elizabeth Sauty Miller and Missie Sauty Armstrong in equal portions, as the children of Algernon Sidney Sauty living at the death of said Theodore S. Sauty.
