That your petitioners qualified as Trustees in the above entitled Case by giving bond to the State of Maryland, conditioned upon the faithful discharge of their duties in the premises, and pursuant to the decree gave three weeks public notice of the time place manner and terms of sale by advertisement inserted in the "Banner of Liberty" a weekly newspaper published in Frederick County, and your Petitioners did attend as the Trustees in Woodburn, Frederick County, Maryland pursuant to said notice on the 10th day of September A.D. 1904, at the hour of Ten O'clock P.M. and then and there offered the real estate decreed to be sold to the highest bidder for cash, and was then and there offered the sum of Twenty one hundred and Two Dollars, the same being the highest and best bid had for said real estate, whereupon petitioners withdrew said property.
