In the name of God. Amen.
I Edward Kamberg, of Frederick County, in the State of Maryland, being in perfect health of body, and of sound and disposing mind, memory, and understanding, Considering the Certainty of death, and the uncertainty of the time thereof, and being desirous to settle my worldly affairs, and thereby to the better prepared to leave this world when it shall please Almighty God to Call me hence, do therefore make and publish this my last Will and testament in manner and form following, that is to say:-

First and principally, I commit my soul into the hands of Almighty God, and my body to the earth, to be decently buried at the discretion of my executors hereinafter named.

After my debts and funeral expenses are paid, I devise and bequeath as follows:-

Item:- I devise and bequeath to my dear wife Sarah C Kamberg the whole of my estate, both real and personal, to have and to hold, for her sole use and benefit, during her lifetime, provided that she remain my widow.

I desire that my executors shall sell my farm at Hubler and also the Mountain plot as soon as practicable, within one year after my decease, By mutual agreement between my wife and my executors my real estate in Washington may also be sold at the same time, in case my wife may not desire to retain it for her home.

After the sale of the real estate aforesaid, my executors shall so place the proceeds as that they may ^{be} secure and the interest arising therefrom be promptly paid annually, to my wife.

And should the interest accruing therefrom year to year prove insufficient for her maintenance and support, then she may take of the principal fifty or seventy five dollars for her immediate use.

At the death of my wife, I desire that after my two sons, American E Kamberg and Charles W. Kamberg, shall have received one hundred and fifty (\$150) Dollars each, to balance gifts previously made to my other children from my estate, the remainder, both real and personal shall be divided equally, among my three
