To the Honorable the Judges of the Circuit Court for Frederick County:-

The report of Edward Kover and Frank L. Stoner, Trustees appointed by a decree of this Court passed in the above entitled Cause, dated the 27th day of January, in the year A. D. 1900, to make sale of certain real estate therein mentioned, respectfully shows:-

That after giving bond with the security for the faithful performance of their trust, and after having complied with all the other prerequisites, as required by law and the said decree, and giving notice of the time place manner and terms of sale by advertisement inserted in the "News" a Daily Newspaper printed and published in Frederick County, for at least three successive weeks before the day of sale they did pursuant to said notice attend at the City Hotel, in Frederick City on the 7th day of March, in the year A. D. 1900, at the hour of 10^o O'clock A. M. and there and then proceeded to sell the said property in manner following, that is to say:- Your Trustees offered at public sale to the highest bidder the property mentioned in said decree, situated in Frederick City, and sold all of the property mentioned in said decree and advertisement of sale in the manner and order in which they are described in said notice: And your petitioners sold the lots or parcels described in said notice of sale as lots Nos 1-2 and 7, to E. Ernest Bauty at and for the sum of \$4200, Forty two hundred dollars \$1250, twelve hundred and fifty dollars, and three hundred and five, \$305, respectively, making in the aggregate, the sum of Fifty seven hundred and fifty dollars, he being the highest and best bidder for said lots, Your petitioners then offered the property described in said notice a sale as lot No. 3 and there and then sold the same to Frank Seman at and for the sum of \$1575 fifteen hundred and twenty five dollars, taking his Certificate of purchase, for the amount of the purchase money being the highest bidder for said lot, Your petitioners then
