law and injury to the parties interested, and it will be more advantageous to all parties, infants or adults, that the same be sold and the proceeds divided among the parties in proportion to their respective rights.

And the plaintiff prays for the following relief: (1st.)— That a decree may be passed for the sale of all of said real estate, and a division of the proceeds of sale among the parties interested, in proportion to their respective rights.

(2nd.)— And for such other and further relief as the case may require.

And the plaintiff pray for the following process:— For the writ of subpoena, directed to the said Grover C. Smith, Edgar T. Smith, Harry J. Smith and Ritchie Smith, infant defendants, commanding them and each of them to be and appear in this Court on some certain day to be therein named to answer the premises and abide by and perform such decree as may be passed therein; and also an order of publication giving notice to the said Cora Smith of the State of Indiana as aforesaid, who is a non resident of this State of the object and substance of this bill, and warning her to appear in this Court, in person or by solicitor, on or before a certain day to be named therein, to show cause if any she has, why a decree ought not to pass as prayed.
