of all Costs Charges and expenses of said sale and the payment of said indebtedness of \$548 37 to the County Commission aforesaid, to be held or invested under the direction of your Honor by your Complainant as your Honor may deem right and proper.

And The Complainant Prays for the following Relief:

1st. That a decree may be passed directing said real estate to be sold, the proceeds to be applied to the payment of said indebtedness of \$548 37, due the County Commission of said Frederick County, and the balance, if any there be, to be held or invested by your Complainant under the direction of your Honor.

2. That an order of Publication may be issued directed to the said Jacob Smith, now resident Defendant, notifying him of the object and substance of this Bill, and commanding him to be and appear in your Honorable Court on some certain day to be named therein to answer said Bill and abide by and perform such decree as may be passed in the premises.

And And for such other further and general relief as the nature of his Case may require.
