Glenn N. Worthington and Julia A. Worthington, his wife vs James H. Lany and Ella M. Lany, his wife, Mary Ann Dunn, and John W. Dunn, her husband Fannie Laker and Charles E. Laker, her husband, and others.

The object of this proceeding is to obtain a decree of the Court construing the deed of Charles H. Schustze and wife to Michael Lany and Sarah E. Lany and to the children of them, and also a decree authorizing a sale of the lot of land and improvements conveyed thereby, and the distribution of the proceeds of sale under the order of the said Court.

The Bill states that the said deed from Schustze and wife, dated December 3, 1887 and recorded among the land records of Frederick County, in Libr N & S, No. 4, at folio 446 &c. purports convey a lot or parcel of land to said Michael Lany and Sarah E. Lany his wife, and to the children of them, the same being located in Frederick County, Maryland.
