issued to the Sheriff of said County and the interest and estate of the said Michael in and to said lot or parcels of land seized, taken into possession and sold by the Sheriff, to Glenn H. Worthington, one of the plaintiffs in the proceedings,

A. deed being given for the same, a Certified Copy of which, and also of a deed from the widow of the said Michael, his second wife, Mollie F. Cary being filed as part of the bill of Complaint.

That the said Complainant, Glenn H. Worthington claims under the Sheriff's deed, above mentioned the whole of said lot of land, or a part thereof, according to the true construction of said deed to carry the true meaning wherein that the children of the said Michael and Sarah, living at the date of said deed, of December 3 1887, were as follows

1. James H. Cary, whose wife's name is Ella <sup>m</sup> Cary,
2. Mary Ann Duman, whose husband's name is John <sup>st</sup> Duman
3. Pallas Lakin, wife of the Charles Lakin of 909, 6th Street Washington D.C.
4. Thomas Cary, whose wife's name is Mary E. Cary,
5. William F. Cary, whose wife's name is Minnie Cary
6. Berdie Long wife of Ralph E. Long,
7. Lula M. Cary, unmarried,
8. Michael Cary, Jr. since deceased, whose widow's name is Annie Cary and whose three children are named respectively: Lester Cary Lawrence Cary and Michael Cary, (III) are infants.

All of said children now being residing in Frederick County, except Pallas Lakin, who resides in Washington, D.C. and Lula M. Cary, who resides in Allegany County, Maryland, and are being adults except the three grand children who reside with their mother at Brunswick, in Frederick County - aforesaid. That the said lot of land cannot be divided without loss and injury and that it would be for the best interests of all the parties interested to see the said lot of land and to divide the proceeds of sale under the order of the Court.

The Bill prays for the true construction of the said deed of December 3 1887 a decree for the sale of the property and for general relief
