

This deed made this seventeenth day of June in the year one thousand nine hundred and three by Catherine E. Falk and John Falk her husband of Frederick County State of Maryland, Witnesseth that in consideration of twelve hundred dollars the receipt of which is hereby acknowledged, we the said Catherine E. Falk and John Falk her husband, do grant unto John William Falk of Frederick City, Maryland, all our right title and interest in the one-half of all that lot or parcel of ground, with the improvements thereon, it being the eastern half of said double house, situated in East Fourth Street, Frederick City, Maryland, No. 58, which is described as follows, fronting on the South side of East Fourth Street fifteen and a half feet, and running back for depth one hundred and forty eight feet and being the eastern half of the same property which was conveyed by deed from Elizabeth Subel on the 5th day of March, 1892 to Catherine E. Falk, being one half of the same property which was conveyed by Elizabeth Subel to the said Catherine E. Falk, by deed dated the fifth day of March, A.D. 1892, and recorded in Liber J. L. J. No. 1, folio 241, one of the Land Records of Frederick County.

And we the said Catherine E. Falk and John Falk her husband, Command that we will warrant generally the property hereby conveyed, and that we will execute such further assurance as may be requisite.
