The Bill of Complaint of William H. Mort and
Elizabeth S. Mort, his wife, respectfully represents unto your
Honors:

1. That both of the Plaintiffs are Adults and reside
in Frederick County, Maryland and that the Defen-
dants Mary M. Mort, Catherine M. Lohr, and
Mary L. Lohr, are all Adults and reside in
said Frederick County, and the said Emma M.
Mort and William T. Mort, are both infants
under the age of 21, and also reside in said
Frederick County Maryland.
2. That on or about the 3rd day of June A. D. 1900
one Frederick R. Mort, late of said Frederick County,
deceased, departed this life, seized and possessed of an
undivided one half interest in certain real estate,
situated in Woodrow district, in said Frederick County,
Maryland, being the same real estate which is described
in a deed from Francis Lohr and Simon Lohr, her
husband, Frederick R. Mort, and Mary Mort, his wife,
William H. Mort and Elizabeth Mort, his wife to William
Mort, and Frederick R. Mort, said deed bearing date April
