In pursuance of the order of the Court, dated on the 18th day of March, 1901 in the above entitled Cause J. Clayton O. Needy, one of the regular examiners of said Court, duly appointed, qualified and sworn having assigned the said 18th day of March 1901 at the office of Glenn N. Worthington Esq. in Frederick City, Maryland as this time and place, for taking testimony in this cause and having given due notice thereof to the parties concerned did at the appointed time and place, proceed to take the following testimony to wit:-

The Plaintiffs filed with the Examiner as evidence Exhibit A, which is herewith returned,

Millard F. Davis, a witness of lawful age produced on the part of the Plaintiffs being duly sworn and examined vis a vis, deposes and says as follows:-

My name is Millard F. Davis, my age is 25 years, I reside near Home No 11, in Frederick County, and know the parties to this cause I am one of the Plaintiffs.

I knew Samuel F. Davis, he was my brother he is dead, he died intestate on or about August 5th 1900, and left no child or children; or descendants but left a widow, named Lattie Davis who is about twenty five years of age and resides in Frederick County.

He is survived by her brother as his only heir at law as follows:-

Millard F. Davis, whose wife's name is Phoebe Davis, Geo. W. Davis, whose wife's name is Jennie Davis all of whom are adults over 21 years of age; and Willie H. Davis aged twenty years who resides in Washington, D. C. and is unmarried.

At the time of his death the said Samuel F. Davis was seized and possessed of certain real estate located near Woodville in Frederick County, consisting of a house and lot of nearly seven
