This Deed made the second day of May in the year eighteen hundred and ninety one by Mr. Thomas W. Hearn of Frederick County, State Maryland, Witnessed that in Consideration of One hundred and fifty dollars, I the said Thomas W. Hearn do grant unto Mary O. Coy, of said County and State the following described Parcel of land situate lying and being in Frederick County, State of Maryland, and conveyed to the said Thomas W. Hearn by deed from Jane Day and wife, dated December 26th, 1851, beginning for the part intended to be conveyed at a Stone at the end of the third line of the deed from the said Thomas W. Hearn to Edward S. Mauer dated May 22<sup>nd</sup> 1879 then with said line runned South 61 1/4° W. 57.65 Perches to a Stone at the beginning of the second line of the deed from said Thomas W. Hearn to Edward S. Mauer dated December 30th, 1882, then with said line North 49 1/2° West 47 1/2° West 35° perches to a Stone then by line of Division North 43 1/2° East 57.50 Perches to a Stone South 45° East, 53 Perches to the beginning containing 15 acres 2. Perches 8. Sq. perches of land more or less in fee Simple Witness my hand and seal.
