Frederick County, sitting as a Court of Equity:-
The report of John Francis Smith, Trustee, appointed by
a decree of this Court handed in the above entitled
Case dated August 8th, A. D., 1906, to convey the
interest of the infant parties in and to certain
real estate therein mentioned under the terms and
conditions contained in a Contract of Sale,
settled into by the said Vinton P. Hoy et al,
and Edward Orew for himself and on behalf
of his children, the infant parties aforesaid, by
which agreement, dated May 8th, A. D., 1906, the said
Vinton P. Hoy et al, and Orew contracted to sell unto
a certain Arthur A. Peddicord, the other party, to said
Contract, the whole of said Real Estate at and for the
sum of Four Hundred and fifty dollars, to be paid, in
Cash upon the ratification of said sale by your Honor-
