A Son George R. Storr, whose wife's name is Edna Storr both of whom are adults, and reside in York, Penna. A Daughter Mollie Keaukey Wife of Geo H Keaukey, both of whom are adults and reside in York, Co. Penna. A Daughter Lydia Fogle wife Ulova W. S. Fogle both of whom are adults, residing in York Co. Penna. A Son John Storr an adult residing in York Co. Pa. A Daughter Anne Storr who died unmarried and without children. She died intestate in the year A. D. 1898. A Daughter Amanda Working who was the wife of James L. Working, and who died intestate in the year 1902. She left surviving her, her husband the said James L. Working, who is an adult, residing in Frederick County and two infant children who reside with their father and their names are Ethel Working who is 12 years of age, and Harry Working who is about 4 years of age.

My mother Ann Elizabeth Storr at the time of her death was indebted unto Theodore L. Zimmerman upon the Promissory Notes filed as Exhibits 1st & 2^d to the Bill of Complaint.

I witnessed the mark of my mother to Exhibit No. 1. and my sister Annie Storr witnessed my mother's mark to Exhibit No. 2. I know the hand writing of my sister Annie Storr and have her write.

This is her genuine signature as witness to my mother's signature by her mark to Exhibit No. 2. The notes represents loans to George R. Storr he was the principal and got the benefits of the loans my mother and the others are the said notes, are Securities thereon.

The amounts yet due and owing upon the notes are to the best of my knowledge set forth in the Bill of Complaint Correctly.

My mother Elizabeth Storr died seized of certain real estate described in Exhibit No 4 to the Bill.

Her personal estate is insufficient for the payment of her debts. While the first Administrators account, stated by George R. Storr Executor shows an apparent balance of \$4450.57, yet this amount was really more than made up of a Promissory Note of my brother John Storr secured by a second mortgage on his farm.
