 S. Ray, to the Plaintiff.

The money represented by Exhibit A, was
 borrowed of me for the use and benefit of William
 S. Ray, and the other names were signed thereto
 as his Sureties; I loaned him the money and
 then latter transferred the note to the Plaintiff.

I am familiar with the mortgage indebtedness
 represented by Exhibit No. 5, filed with the Clerk
 The Principal thereof of \$2000 = is due and
 unpaid, with interest thereon from May 6-1905.

Charles W. Zimmerman, a witness of lawful

I knew William S. Ray in
 his life time. He is dead. He died in Frederick
 County, on Dec. 28-1905, and left no will.

He was seized and possessed of real
 estate situated in Frederick County, at the time
 of his death: Exhibit Nos 1, 2 & 3, now shown
