James H. Robinson, a witness of lawful age produced
on the part of the Plaintiff being first duly sworn and
examined viva-voce deposes and says as follows =

My name is James H. Robinson, I am 47 years of age
and I reside in Frederick City, Maryland. I am
the Plaintiff in this Cause, I am a nephew
of Anna B. and Harriet Ann Knox late of
Frederick County, Maryland, deceased, they were
sisters of my mother, Anna B. Knox, died intestate
in August 1877, unmarried and leaving no direct
heir, Harriet Ann Knox died intestate July 14, 1906,
unmarried and leaving no direct heir, these ladies
in their life time were seized and possessed of
a small tract of a land of 6. N. 1 Rod &
95. 75. perches, which they divided under the last
Will, and testament of their Father John Knox,
who died about 1865. There is an old log house
on the property, but it is uninhabitable, and
the whole property is worth probably \$100.00 these
ladies were abt. about 70 years old at the
time of their death, they left no personal property
of any consequence, not sufficient to pay their debts
and the funeral expenses, when Aunt Ann died
her personal property was sold and the proceeds
applied to the payment of the funeral expenses
as far as it would go and the deficit, I
made up out of my own pocket, the whole of
these expenses amounted to about \$55.00. When
Aunt Harriet died there was nothing to pay
her funeral expenses with, she was an inmate
of Monticello. I paid for funeral expenses to the
amount of \$39.00 to the undertaker and grave-diggers
and by their assignment of their claims, and they
are filed in this case as Exhibits #3. The heirs
at law of Anna B. and Harriet Ann Knox
are the children of her deceased Brothers and Sisters
as follows = a widowed niece Sarah E. Smith; a
Nephew; George W. Robinson whose wife's name is Ida
B.; a nephew Charles E. Robinson whose wife's name is
Alice W.; a niece Emma C. Smith whose husband's
name is William C. Smith; a niece Ann B. Miller
