 the visitation of God. And the Jurors  
 aforesaid do also find that the said  
 Jane Button, is the owner of a certain  
 tract or parcel of Real estate situate,  
 in Frederick County which will be found  
 described in a certain deed from Mary  
 Traxell to Mary Button, her mother, now  
 deceased, bearing date, April 13<sup>th</sup> A.D. 1838  
 and duly recorded in Lib. J. S. No. 48,  
 Folio 500, one of the Land records for Frederick  
 County; and which tract of land the  
 said Jane Button, took, as heir at law,  
 upon the death of her mother, which  
 real Estate, the Jurors find to be of the  
 value of one Hundred Dollars,  
 And the Jurors further find, that the  
 said Jane Button, has no relations  
 or next of Kin, of which they are able  
 to ascertain.
