In pursuance of the order of the Court contained in the Decree pro Confesso, heretofore made in this cause, and notice given me by the solicitor for the plaintiffs in the above entitled cause, I Selwyn O. Needy, one of the regular Examiners of said Court duly appointed, qualified and sworn, having assigned the 25th day of January 1907, at my office in Frederick City, as the time and place for taking the testimony in this cause and having given due notice thereof to the parties concerned, did at the appointed time and place proceed to take the following testimony, to-wit:-

The Plaintiffs filed with the Examiner as evidence Exhibit "C. M." which is herewith returned by the said Examiner -

Beecher L. Ohler a witness of lawful age produced on the part of the Plaintiff being duly sworn and examined. Viva Voce deposes and says as follows:-

My name is Beecher L. Ohler; my age 40 years; I reside at Emmitsburg in Frederick County. I know all the parties to this suit except Keram Forney and the Unknown Heirs of Leatham Forney wife of Keram Forney.

I knew Elizabeth Morrison in her life time who was the wife of Reuben Morrison she is dead and died intestate fifteen or sixteen years ago, being a resident of Frederick County, at the time, she left no children, but left a husband, Reuben Morrison who died in September 1906.

The said Elizabeth Morrison left as her heirs
