I, John Shank of Frederick County, in the State of Maryland, being weak of body but of sound and disposing mind, memory and understanding, Considering the certainty of death and the uncertainty of the time thereof and being desirous to settle my worldly affairs and thereby be the better prepared to leave this world when it shall please God to call me hence do therefore make and publish this my last Will and Testament in manner and form following that is to say:

First and principally I Commit my Soul into the hands of Almighty God and my body to the earth to be decently buried at the discretion of my Executor named.

After my debts and funeral charges are paid I devise and bequeath as follows: - That all my personal property remaining in my hands at my death to be sold by my Executor hereinafter named. I will and bequeath unto my Brother namely Peter Shank, George Shank, Jacob Shank, and William Shank all that I may own at the time of my death of both personal and real estate share and share alike.

I will and bequeath unto my brother William Shank my house where I now live with all the lands and appurtenances thereto including a mountain lot, lying and being in Frederick County, with the right of way thereto from the public road said lot known as the Hoffman lot. I will, that my brother William Shank have in his two named tracts of land for the value of Eight hundred dollars, \$800- for his natural life and after his death said lands with all the improvements thereon to be sold and the proceeds equally divided amongst his legal heirs, share and share alike.

I will also that any and all monies that may remain in my Executor's hands, belonging to my brother William; after the Eight hundred dollars
