William Shauk to have the same during his natural life. the same to be sold at his death and the proceeds of sale equally divided among his legal heirs. Share and share alike, and your petitioners file as part hereof a Certified Copy of said will ^{marked} exhibit No. 1.

2. That said John Shauk by said will also directed to any and all money that should remain in the hands of his executors (who are your petitioners), belonging to said William Shauk after the eight hundred dollars already bequeathed in real estate should be held by his Executors in trust for him the said William Shauk by paying him the interest thereon or to purchase land for the same for him the said William Shauk to have the sole use of during his natural life and after his death to be sold and the proceeds of sale equally divided between his legal heirs, as will appear fully from said Exhibit No. 1.

3. That the amount of money now in the hands of your Executors distributed to them in trust as set forth in the second paragraph of this petition is \$399.44, as will appear from Certificate thereof herewith filed marked exhibit No. 2, which is the final distribution of said John Shauk's estate.

4. That your petitioners think it best to invest said money in a piece of real estate containing 18. acres, 1 rood and 26 perches of land described in a deed from John Shauk and others to Charles C. Shauk dated on the 30th day of March A. D. 1885, and recorded in Liber A. F. No. 11, folio 118 v. one of the land records of Franklin County, which is fully worth the above named sum of \$399.44, and it is also the desire of said William Shauk and of his family that this should be done.

Your petitioners therefore pray for an Order authorizing them as trustees (who are entitled to the protection of a Court of Equity in the execution of their trust), to purchase said real estate for the sum of \$399.44, less the costs and expenses of this proceeding and to take a conveyance of the same as instructed by the trust clause in said will and as in duty lie.
