In the name of God Amen. I George W. Shant, of Frederick County, in the State of Maryland, being of sound and disposing mind, memory and understanding do make declare and publish this my last will and testament in manner and form following, that is to say, after my just debts and funeral charges are paid.

I give devise and bequeath unto my brother Charles E. Shant, or in the event of his death first, then unto my sister-in-law Mary L. Shant, wife of my brother Charles E. Shant, all my property of whatever manner or kind either personal real or mixed whenever it may exist or be located, or any manner of kind of property that I may yet come into possession of during my lifetime or that I may inherit through my mother Susan Shant wife of William Shant, or that may descend by or through the will of my grand father or uncle John Shant deceased, my said brother Charles W. Shant, to come into possession of all my property (of whatever manner, or whatever inheritance the same as I would or could were I alive,) immediately after my demise. Solely and ~~uninterruptedly~~ with same collective or conveying power that I would use were I alive.

And lastly, I do hereby constitute and appoint my brother Charles E. Shant, my Executor (without bond) of this my last will and testament, revoking any and all former wills by me heretofore made, ratifying and confirming this and none other to be my last will and testament, in testimony whereof I have hereunto set my hand and affixed my seal this 13th day of February, in the year Eighteen hundred and Ninety eight.
