Office of the Register of Wills of Frederick County, among other things did devise and bequeath as follows:-  
 "IV. I give, devise and bequeath all the rest and residue of my real estate and all my bonds, notes, mortgages and accounts to my nephew, George Wesley Hindley, in trust, to hold the same to hold the same upon the following trusts, to wit:- Upon trust to hold, manage and reinvest the same and to collect the rents, profits, interest and income thereof, and to pay all taxes and other necessary expenses and repairs and to pay over the net proceeds thereof from time to time to my wife Mary C. Hindley for the term of her natural life and upon her death then in trust to sell and convey said real estate at either Public or Private Sale as he may deem most advantageous and to collect said bonds, notes, mortgages and accounts, and then in trust to pay the proceeds of such sales and collections as follows:-

(a) To Charles K. Davis and John O. Barnes, Jr., as trustees, to safely invest the same, the sum of Two Hundred Dollars, and to pay over the income arising therefrom annually towards the salary of the pastor of the Pleasant Grove Methodist Protestant Church of Frederick County; and in case the said Church should cease to be used as a place of regular Public Worship by said denomination for a period of three years, then this trust to cease and the principal and accrued interest to be paid to the Maryland Superannuated Fund of the Methodist Protestant Church.

(b) To "The Minutes and Trustees of the Pleasant Grove Methodist Protestant Church in Frederick County, in the State of Maryland", a body Corporate, the sum of Two Hundred Dollars, the income of which I desire shall be applied to the maintenance and repair of the Cemetery Connected with said Church.

(c) To my friend Rev. J. M. Lucas of Denton, Caroline County, Md. the sum of Two Hundred Dollars.

(d) To my nephew, John Newton Hindley, the sum of Four Hundred Dollars.

(e) To my nephew, Bradley H. Hindley, the sum of Six Hundred Dollars.

(f) To Mrs. Annie Miller the sum of Four Hundred Dollars, provided she be living at the time of the distribution hereunder, but if she be dead at that time, said legacy to lapse and fall into the residuum hereinafter disposed of.

(g) To my nephew, William Ernest Hindley the sum
