The petition and report of sales of James N. Brown and

1st. That petitioners qualified as trustees, as required by  
the terms of decree of your honorable court passed in the  
above entitled cause by giving bond by said decree prescribed  
and pursuant to the terms of said decree gave their  
wells public notice of the time place manner and terms
