2. That all of the Children of the Said Preston S. Deviltis, deceased, are now adults and over twenty-one years of age and they and Mollie L. Deviltis, widow of Said Preston S. Deviltis, deceased, are desirous of holding said real estate and having the Same conveyed to them and the Said Trust terminated and relinquished and your Petitioners discharged from its further execution, and to that end have filed their Petition in your Honorable Court asking that your Petitioners may be authorized to convey the balance of said real estate not heretofore sold, to them so that they shall hold the Same in the Same manner as if said decree for sale had never been passed.

3. That your Petitioners are willing to be discharged from said trust and to convey said property to the said widow and children of Said Preston S. Deviltis, deceased, under the order, direction and Protection of your Honorable Court.
