This Respondent answering Says, That he admits
to be true the allegations of the 1st. Paragraph of Said
Petition.

2. This Respondent admits all the allegations of the
2nd Paragraph of the Said Petition except the
allegations that Said James Baker was in his life
time indebted "also to some other persons in various
amounts of money" which allegation, this Respondent denies.
Answering the 3rd Alleg. Paragraph of Said Petition
this Respondent admits that letters of Administration
were taken out as charged in Said Paragraph.

but these Respondents Says that since the filing of Said
Petition an account has been stated by Said Administrator.
4. Answering the 4th. Paragraph of Said Petition
this Respondent Says, That he admits that the personal
estate in the hands of Said Administrator is insufficient
to pay the debt due Said O. P. Levy mentioned in Said
Paragraph and this Respondent does not object to Said
indebtedness being paid. So far as the Personal estate is
insufficient out of the proceeds of Sale mentioned in
Said Petition, but this Respondent utterly denies the existence
of any other debts as owing by Said James Baker in his
life time, and that any other debts than that of Said
Levy, as mentioned in Said Petition are entitled to be paid
