

NO 8297. Equity.

Brunner is not sufficient to pay the debts due and owing at the time of the death of the said Edward A. Brunner deceased, and that the real estate heretofore mentioned or so much thereof as may be necessary, should be sold under a decree of your Honorable Court and the proceeds applied to the payment of the claim of your Complainant and the claims of the other Creditors who may come in and contribute to the expenses of these proceedings. Said claim of your Complainant as well as all other claims to be paid after the mortgage debt with all interest due thereon shall have been first satisfied and paid out of the proceeds of said sale of said heretofore mentioned real estate, and expenses incurred herein.

To the end therefore:

First, That the real estate aforesaid may be sold under a decree of your Honorable Court, and the proceeds thereof applied first to the payment of the mortgage debt with all interest due thereon; second to the payment of the claim of your Complainant, and all other Creditors of said deceased. Second, That your Complainant may have such other and further relief as the nature and Equity of his case may require.

May it please your Honor to grant unto your Complainant the writ of Subpoena in the usual form against the said Annie W. Ropot, and usual form against the said Annie W. Ropot and William W. Ropot, her husband, Mattie S. Gittinger and Samuel Gittinger, her husband, Jennie Mainhart and John Mainhart, her husband all adults, Maggie Brunner and Paul Brunner infants Susan Laura Fairburg, Guardian, Mortgagee all residents of Prince Georges County, Maryland and Frances E. Kemp, George E. Brunner, Iowa Wilson and J. Homer Wilson, her husband all adults, all residents of Baltimore City, Commanding them and each of them to be and appear in your Honorable Court on some day certain to be named therein, to answer the petition and show cause if any they have, why a decree should not issue as prayed and an order of Publication giving notice to said Charles L. Brunner and his wife, both adults non residents of Maryland whose whereabouts is unknown to your Complainants of the object and substance of this Bill warning them to appear in this Court in person or by solicitor, on or before a certain day, to be named therein, to show cause, if any they have why a decree
