

## NO. 8170 Equity.

Isabella M. Baker, administratrix ought to be applied to the payment of the Claims of your Orator, and other Creditors of the Said Nicholas Baker, deceased. So far as the Same will extend, and that any deficiency in Said Personal estate ought to be supplied by the Sale of all, or such part as may be necessary of the real estate of the aforesaid Deftor.

17th. That the Said Isabella M. Baker, administratrix of Nicholas Baker, deceased, has wholly refused and failed to pay any part of your Orator's Claims. To the ends therefore,

(A) That an account may be taken under the direction of this Court of the Said debts, due as aforesaid to your Orator, and of all other debts, due which are owing by Said estate at the time of his death, and which still remains unpaid; and also of the Personal estate and effects of the Said estate received by or for the use of the Said Isabella M. Baker as administratrix aforesaid.

(B) That the Said Personal estate may be applied in the due Course of Administration, in payment of the debts of the estate due to your Orator and all other Creditors who may come in and contribute to the expense of this Suit.

(C) That the Said real estate of the Said Nicholas Baker, deceased, or so much thereof as may be necessary for the purpose, may be sold for the payment of such much of the aforesaid debts, as may remain unsatisfied by the application of the Personal estate as aforesaid.

(D) That your Orator may have such other and further relief as his case may require.

May it please your Honor to grant your Orator the writ of Subpoena, directed to the Said Alice M. Baker, J. Bernard, Baker Administratrix of Nicholas Baker deceased, Mary D. Blutehark, and John J. Blutehark, her Husband, Jennie M. Adelsberger, George E. Blutz, and Harry F. Shipley and George S. C. Bopst, Copartners trading as Shipley and Bopst, all of Frederick County, Maryland, and to the Said Charles N. Baker and Mary D.
