At the request of Martin E. B. Stollenper the following deed is received for record and recorded February 24-1870.

This deed made this 19th day of February in the year Eighteen hundred and seventy by Jacob F. Swope and Margaret Swope, his wife, of Frederick County, in the State of Maryland. Witnesses, That in consideration of one thousand and seventy five dollars, the said Jacob F. Swope and wife do grant unto Martin E. B. Stollenper of Frederick County and contained in the following metes and bounds viz.

Beginning at the end of 94 feet on the 17th line of the whole tract called "The Range" about the Three miserable knots" and running thence with the said line S. 5° N. 2 1/2° W. to the end of said 17th line the N. 28° N. 80° W. then N. 10° N. 8° W. then by a straight line to the place of beginning containing 10 acres of land more or less
