

No 8313. Equity.

A daughter Emma M. Sayler whose husband's name is Isaac H. Sayler, both of whom are adults and reside in Frederick County, Maryland.

A daughter Marcie L. Eckard whose husband's name is William A. Eckard, both of whom are adults and reside in Frederick County, Maryland. All of whom are Your Honorable Court's co-defendants and co-plaintiffs in the proceeding.

A Son Harry Weiselman one of the defendants who is an adult, unmarried, and who resides in Frederick County, Maryland.

Two Sons by her latter marriage, both of whom are infant defendants in this cause, and whose names are Frank M. Palmer and Claude Palmer, both of whom reside in Frederick County, Maryland.

And a surviving husband James H. Palmer who is about 50 years of age and resides in Frederick County, Maryland.

4th.

That the real estate aforesaid of which the said Laura V. Weiselman died seized and possessed as aforesaid is not susceptible of partition or division without material loss and injury to the parties entitled to interests therein as above stated, and that in order to make division of said interests, it will be necessary that said real estate be sold, and the proceeds thereof be divided amongst the parties according to their several interests.

5th.

That it would be to the interest and advantage of all the parties and especially to the interest of the infants that the said mentioned and described real estate be sold under a decree of your Honorable Court, and the proceeds divided according to the interests of all the parties to this cause.

To the end therefore, -

(A.)

That a decree may be passed for the Sale of the said real estate.

(B.)

That the proceeds of said Sale may be distributed between your complainants and the defendants according to their respective rights and interests.

(C.)

That your complainants may have such other and further relief as the nature of their case may require.
