This deed made this 20th day of March in the year Nineteen Hundred and five, by us, Harry L. Saylor and Florence S. Saylor, his wife, of York, Pennsylvania.

Witnesseth: - That in consideration of the sum of Sixteen hundred dollars, we, the said Harry L. Saylor and Florence S. Saylor, his wife, do hereby grant, sell free simple, unto Laura S. Palmer of Frederick County, in the State of Maryland of Maryland, all that lot or parcel of Ground together with the improvements thereon situate in Walkersville, Frederick County, Maryland, beginning for the same at the end of 253.60 perches on or by the end line of the deed from Charles H. Burrier to William de. Kinea recorded in Liber D. S. P. No. 13, folio 632, one of the Land Records of Frederick County, and running with the outlines of said deed N. 62 1/2° E. 44. 8 1/10 perches thence S. 22 1/4° E. 16 7/100 perches thence S. 68 3/4° N. 3 perches, thence N. 27° W. 15. 5/100 perches to the place of beginning containing 61 1/8 perches of land, more or less.
