

No. 7845, County.

This Inquisition taken this 7th day of December A.D. 1904, at 12. O'Clock M. at the Court House in Frederick City, Frederick County in the State of Maryland, before Charles J. H. Young, Esquire, the Sheriff of Said County, in virtue of the annexed writ de Lunatico inquirendo to him directed, issued out of the Circuit Court for Frederick County, upon the oaths and affirmations of William L. Binky, Charles Northman, Charles H. Quinn, David A. Castle, Louis E. Mullins, Allen G. Quinn, Samuel H. Thomas, Charles J. Wall, Uriah A. Lough, an Eugene Sigurdson, Samuel H. Wall and Adolphus H. Harrington, good and lawful men of the bailiwick, who being sworn and charged upon their oaths and affirmations to enquire as to the sanity of Nettie G. Keeler, Witnesseth:-

That the Jurors aforesaid do find that the said Nettie G. Keeler in the said writ named, is of unsound mind with lucid intervals, so that she is not capable of the government of herself or the management of her estate, and that she has been in such state of mind for about two (2) years, but how she became so the Jurors aforesaid cannot say unless by the visitation of God.

And the Jurors aforesaid do also find that the said Nettie G. Keeler is seized of a house and lot of ground situated in Thurmont in Frederick County, Maryland, which is described in the deed therefor to the said Nettie G. Keeler from Mattie M. Dossell et al, dated March 3rd, 1904 and recorded in Liber T. S. N. No. 265, folio 55B, one of the Land Records of said County, and they do not find that she had when in such unsound mind aliened any lands or tenements.

And the Jurors aforesaid do also find that the next of kin of the said Nettie G. Keeler is her father, James H. Gambrell and her heirs at law are her brothers and sisters, as follows:-

Richard Gambrell, C. Stacy Gambrell, Minnie Marshall wife of John W. Marshall, James H. Gambrell Jr, Peter G. Gambrell, Mamie Robertson wife of John W. Roberts, Blanche Jones, wife, wife of J. Toole Jones, and Arthur S. Gambrell, all of whom are adults.
