I had never seen the note then. I wrote to them last Dec. a year ago. that I could pay the half of it. but that was my money. but they would not accept.

Had your husband been in the habit of being the surety of John Wolf in other promissory notes. (Excepted to)

Ans

From what I found he must have been.

What relation was John Wolf to you (Excepted to)

Ans

He was my father.

12. St.

What relation was Margaret Wolf to you (Excepted to)

Ans

She was my mother.

13. St.

Was not the note for \$250- just shown you also filed against your husband's estate in the Orphan's Court at the time you were administering the same Except to.

Ans

If it was I did not know it. They told me of it when I went to make my settlement. but said there was nothing there to pay it.

Who has paid the interest on the Mortgage to which you have referred since the death of your husband; if any such have been paid?

Ans

The first six months I paid out of the Sale money and the balance I paid out of my own money. The interest is paid up to 1908.
