James Wesley Brown, a witness of lawful age produced on the part of the Plaintiff being first duly sworn and examined viva voce. Depose and says as follows.

He was then in Hamiburg Pennsylvania, my wife had a son by a former marriage, whose name is William E. Patel and his wife's name is Lizzie Patel they live in Baltimore Maryland. This property is not capable of being divided without loss and injury and could not be divided amongst all these people, the only way to do it would be to sell the property and divide the money.
