I hereby Certify, that at the request of Joseph London and Zachariah London, sons of John London late of Frederick County, State of Maryland, deceased, who by his last Will and Testament bequeathed unto his said two sons his Real Estate to be equally divided between them, that I have carefully surveyed the same, and divided it according to their instructions.

The following Course and distances including Joseph London's part of said estate, Beginning at the end of the 24th. line of a tract of land called "Poles Industry" Situated in Frederick County Maryland and Running as follows; North 47 1/2 East 1 6/10 per to a Stone, 2 North 49 1/2 East 21 per to a Stone, 3 North 8 1/4 East 30 per to a Stone, 4 North 8 1/4 East 4 1/2 per to a Stone, 5 South 16 1/2 East 39 per to a Stone, 6 South 107 East 26 7/10 per to a Stone, 7 South 53 West 35 1/2 per to a Stone, 8 South 25 West 136 per to a Stone, 9 North 35 1/2 West 34 7/10 per to a Stone at the end of the 3d. line of the deed from George Horn to John H.
