Namely a daughter Virgie A. Moleworth residing in Frederick County, Maryland, and Ruby P. Moleworth a daughter residing in the State of Indiana; the Bill further alleges that said property cannot be divided without great loss or injury to the parties interested therein that the only way a division of the respective interests can be made is by a sale of the said lands and a division of the proceeds and that it would be to the interest and advantage of the infants and all other parties to have the same sold under a decree of your Honorable Court. It then asks that a Subpoena be issued for the resident defendants and that an order of Publication issue against the following non-residents: Robert G. London whose wife's name is unknown, residents of the State of Texas. Rachel G. Zepf and Jesse Zepf her husband residents of the State of Ill., Theodore W. Moleworth whose wife's name is unknown, residents of the State of Texas. Beulah J. Moleworth a resident of the State of Indiana. Ruby P. Moleworth a resident of the State of Indiana.

It is thereupon on this 15th day of May, in the 1908 ordered by the Circuit Court for Frederick County, in Equity, that the Plaintiff by causing a copy of this order to be inserted in some newspaper published in Frederick County, once in each of four successive weeks before the 18th day of June A.D. 1908. give notice to the said absent defendants of the object and substance of this Bill requiring them to appear in this Court in person or by an attorney on or before the 4th day of July 1908. and show cause, if any they why a decree ought not to pass as prayed.
