- (5) A daughter Eula H. who is unmarried, not of full age, and resides in Frederick County, Maryland.
- (6) A son, Henry O. who is unmarried, is not of full age and resides in Frederick County, Maryland.

Eighth: That administration of all and singular the personal estate of the said Oscar P. Hartbaugh has been granted by the Orphans Court, of Frederick County, Maryland, to Margaret Rebecca Hartbaugh, who in virtue thereof has possessed herself of the said personal estate of the said Oscar P.
