

NO. 8346. Equity.

Margaret Rebecca Harbaugh, one of the defendants, a witness of lawful age produced on the part of the Plaintiff having been duly sworn depone and says.

My name is Margaret Rebecca Harbaugh. I am the widow of Oscar F. Harbaugh, late of Frederick County, who died the 22nd. of July 1908. He left no will. He resided at the time of his death. Certain real estate situated and lying in Frederick County, Maryland. I look at Exhibit No. C. It correctly describes the tract of 10 acre 3 rods and 31 perches. Then he had a tract of land containing 5 acres and 3 rods, that was conveyed to him by Chas. E. Harbaugh atty. by deed, dated, Jan'y 21st. 1901.

The first named tract has upon it an improvement consisting of a two story log house, and a frame Barn.

This Property is worth about from \$800- to \$1000-.

I am the Administrator of my husband's estate or property, and his personal property is not nearly sufficient to pay his debts by \$700- to \$1000- I know that Mr. Harbaugh was indebted to the Mutual Insurance Company of Washington County, in the sum of \$1500- upon a mortgage executed by my husband and me, to Alexander Neil, dated March 21st. 1900, and fully described in paper filed marked Exhibit "A".

Exhibit A, offered in Evidence, and he was likewise indebted by a mortgage made by us in the sum of \$200- and fully described in "Exhibit B"

This mortgage was made by my husband and myself to Mr. Alexander Neil and by him assigned to the Mutual Insurance Company, of Washington C.

Both of these mortgages with a certain amount of interest thereon remain unpaid.

Mr. Harbaugh left surviving him myself, Margaret R. Harbaugh, my age is 47 years, an adult son Joseph E. Harbaugh, unmarried, an adult daughter, Dorothy, who is intermarried with George W. Johnson, an adult daughter Elsie N. who is intermarried with William Lehman, and the following infant children: A son William N. a daughter - Ella N. a son Harry O. All of whom are infants residing with me, in Frederick County, Md. Mr. Harbaugh, owned other lands
